Bellingham, WA — Mount Baker Theatre (MBT) is thrilled to announce the national tour of Come From Away, a Broadway musical based on the true story of the small town that welcomed the world. The show will make its Bellingham debut on the MBT Main Stage for a two-night performance run on Tuesday, October 29, and Wednesday, October 30.

Come From Away tells the remarkable true story of 7,000 stranded passengers and the small town in Newfoundland that welcomed them. Cultures clash and nerves run high, but uneasiness turns into trust, music soars into the night, and gratitude grows into enduring friendships.
